Independent Study or Research Course

University Scholars may receive credit towards the USP course requirement through successful completion of approved 400-level independent study or independent research courses. To receive credit, a student must complete the Request for Credit form and

submit it to the University Scholars Program office at the beginning of the semester in which the course is taken. [PLEASE NOTE: (1) Some courses listed can also be used for internships, experimental courses or special topics courses. These courses cannot be used towards fulfillment of USP requirements. Only courses taken for independent study or independent research work will be accepted. (2) Students cannot receive USP credit for courses required for their major.] The required form and the list of approved courses for this process can be found at <https://scholars.dasa.ncsu.edu/current/forms/>.

Study Abroad

University Scholars may use up to 6 hours of study abroad credit towards their 12 hours of required coursework. To receive credit and register those hours, the online form must be completed along with a 4-6 page reflection paper that will be submitted with the form.

Student-Initiated Honors Contract

The Honors Contract process allows students to earn Honors course credit through contracts with faculty. The contract may be for work done independently by a student under faculty supervision or may be made between faculty members and teams of students working on a common project.

Contracts for Honors Credit may be developed in advance by members of the faculty who agree to supervise Honors work (faculty-initiated) or may be proposed by students to members of the faculty in whose courses they are or plan to be enrolled (student-initiated).
